

## RFP#8505 On Call Sewer Trenchless Rehabilitation Services

### Questions and Responses

#### Question #1

We see that no minimums shall be stated by contractor in their response. Would each work order be passed along to more than one contractor per scope of work (we interpret several references that SacSewer expects multiples)? If so, would a contractor be allowed to pass on a particular task order (i.e. due to conflicts in schedule or something similar)?

#### Response #1

SacSewer bundles typically have multiple locations that will have similar types of work. However, until construction has started there is always a chance that additional work will be needed that cannot be accounted for in the original scope of the project. Thus, SacSewer does not guarantee to purchase any minimum quantities and instead will pay for time and materials as agreed to by the contractor and the CMID inspector.

Work orders will be bundled together as a single project. The contractor with the lowest bid will be the one to win that project. When the next group of work orders are put out as a project, the bidding will be open to all contractors that are on the RFP list – even the contractor who won the previous project assuming that they have the ability to complete both projects within the allotted time frame.

The order in which the contractor chooses to perform their work is under their control. The only constraint is that the contract must finish by the date listed in the documentation.
